AI Overview

2. UL 568: This standard addresses fiberglass cable trays, covering construction, performance, and testing for safe application in supporting power or control cables.
3. IEC 61537: An international standard for all-metal and nonmetallic cable trays, specifying requirements and tests for supporting cables and electrical equipment in installations.
4. NEC (NFPA 70): Article 392 of the NEC provides installation requirements for cable trays, including ladder, ventilated trough, channel, and solid bottom types. Article 310 covers ampacities of conductors within cable trays, ensuring safe electrical performance.
5. NFPA 79: Focuses on industrial machinery and mass production equipment, ensuring safe application of electrical/electronic systems, including cable tray supports.
6. CEC C22.1-Part 1: Canadian Electrical Code section 12-2200 specifies methods of installation, ampacities, and conductor arrangements in cable trays.

Components of Cable Tray Support Systems According to DIN EN 61537 and practical guides:

- Support elements: Wall brackets, suspended supports, and center suspensions that attach trays to ceilings, walls, or floors.
- Mounting elements: Plates or fasteners for junction boxes or equipment on trays.
- Fittings: Horizontal/vertical bends, T-pieces, crossovers, reductions, and end closures to route cables.
- Accessories: Covers, barrier strips, and cable protection rings for safety and...
