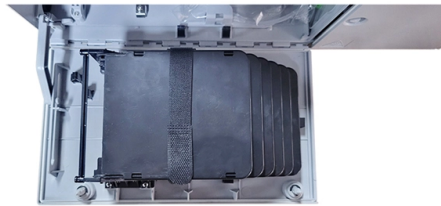


Can access layer switches be configured with IP addresses



Overview

Layer 3 routing capabilities are deployed on the access layer switches. As a result, Layer 3 switches are configured with IP addresses on their Switched Virtual Interfaces (SVIs) or routed ports and they participate in a routing protocol such as OSPF. The following are the key components of OSPF: A. A switch operates within a single VLAN and broadcast domain, which matches one IP subnet. It uses a flood-and-learn process to flood frames with unknown MAC addresses to all devices within the VLAN. We explain this process in more detail in our Ethernet course, which is part of the CCNA learning. The following procedure is required to configure Layer 3 Interfaces (Ethernet, VLAN, loopback, and tunnel interfaces) with IPv4 or IPv6 addresses so that the firewall can perform routing on these interfaces. Moreover, you can configure also a Switch Virtual. Configuration of Switch is little different from that of Router or firewall where the interfaces are Layer 3 ports and IP address needs to be assigned to the physical ports.
