Standard single-mode BiDi modules cannot operate reliably on multimode fiber due to mode mismatch, excessive coupling loss, and high bit-error rates.

Practical Use Cases: Multimode single-fiber modules are rare and usually deployed in short-reach, cost-sensitive networks, such as data centers or campus LANs. For longer distances or high-speed applications (25G+), single-mode fiber is preferred because multimode fiber suffers from modal dispersion and limited insertion-loss budgets.

Connector and Wavelength Matching: Even if the fiber type is compatible, the module must match the connector type (LC, SC, MPO) and the wavelength pair for bidirectional communication. Mismatched connectors or wavelengths can result in unreliable links.
