

## Columbia Cable Tray Standard

Columbia University specifies cable tray systems for low-voltage applications with strict installation, support, grounding, and fire safety requirements. Scope and Application Columbia's cable tray standard applies to low-voltage cables such as telecom, security, and audio/visual systems. Fire alarm cables are explicitly prohibited from being installed in these trays. The standard ensures that cable trays are properly supported, grounded, and accessible for maintenance.

**Usage Warning:** Cable trays are not to be used as walkways, ladders, or supports for personnel.

**Grounding and Bonding** Cable trays must be grounded and bonded to ensure continuous electrical conductivity. The tray itself can serve as an equipment ground conductor only for the tray system, not for connected equipment.

**Materials and Types** Columbia's standard aligns with industry standards such as NEC, NEMA, CSA, and IEC 61537. Common materials include:

- Steel:** Pre-galvanized or hot-dip galvanized for corrosion resistance.
- Aluminum:** Lightweight with excellent corrosion resistance.
- Stainless Steel:** AISI 316L for high corrosion resistance in harsh environments.
- Fiberglass/Nonmetallic:** For chemical or highly corrosive environments.

Tray types include ladder, ventilated trough, solid bottom, channel, and wire mesh, each selected based on load, cable type, and environmental conditions.
