

Connecting the neutral wire to a four-wire distribution box

Strip the insulation from the end of the neutral wire, exposing enough copper to make a secure connection. Insert the neutral wire into an available terminal on the neutral bus bar. Ensure the wire is fully seated and the screw is tightened firmly to prevent loose connections. Keep the neutral and ground separate. The neutral bus bar may be bonded to the box only at the main service panel; in subpanels, the neutral must remain isolated from the ground to prevent unwanted current flow. Organize the wires neatly inside the box, using plastic ties if necessary, to avoid strain on the terminals and maintain clear separation between phase, neutral, and ground wires. Verify connections with a multimeter before restoring power. Measure voltage between each hot wire and neutral (should read ~230V or 120V depending on your system) and between neutral and ground (should read 0V) to confirm proper wiring.
