Role of Electric Distribution Boxes Electric distribution boxes, or switchboards, were essential components of the urban electrical grid. They served to distribute electricity from central power plants to residential, commercial, and industrial users, regulate voltage, and provide safety mechanisms such as fuses or circuit breakers. During the Republican Era, these boxes were often imported from foreign manufacturers, reflecting the dominance of European and American electrical firms in China. However, by World War I, domestic firms began producing simpler electrical equipment, including distribution panels, to meet growing urban demand. Design and Function Distribution boxes of the period were typically metal or wooden enclosures housing switches, fuses, and busbars. They were installed in public utility substations, factories, and large residential buildings. Their design emphasized functionality and safety, though standards were not yet fully codified, and practices varied widely between cities and regions. In some cases, distribution boxes were integrated with metering devices to monitor electricity consumption, reflecting the early developm...
