

Exposed wiring terminals in power distribution box



Overview

Live electrical parts in these power distribution systems are enclosed with covers to protect workers. If easily combustible materials, such as paper or cardboard, are stored near unprotected energized. In industrial settings or during routine maintenance, an uninsulated Aluminum Cable Lug terminal inside an electrical cabinet often becomes the weakest link in the entire system. This seemingly minor oversight directly impacts equipment reliability and operator safety. So if you can touch a bare part, then it's considered exposed. Some common. Both the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) require the insulation and protection of wiring energized at 50 volts or higher if the wiring is equal to or below eight feet off the ground. Both OSHA and NFPA also prohibit direct. Exposed wires represent a serious hazard within any structure, from a simple appliance cord to permanent wiring concealed within walls.
