For FTTH server rooms, cold aisles are typically 1.2 meters wide with a maximum length of 16 meters, optimized for airflow, safety, and serviceability. Cold Aisle Layout and Dimensions Cold aisles are formed by arranging server racks so that the fronts of the racks face each other, creating a corridor where cold air is supplied to the equipment intakes. Airflow and Containment Efficient cooling requires separation of hot and cold air to prevent mixing, which can reduce cooling efficiency and increase energy consumption. Strategies include: Cold Aisle Containment: Physical barriers such as sliding doors, vinyl curtains, or ceiling panels can enclose the cold aisle, directing cold air precisely to server intakes. Perforated Floor Tiles: Deliver cold air from underfloor plenum directly into the cold aisle, ensuring uniform temperature distribution. Hot Aisle Exhaust: Hot air exits the back of racks into adjacent hot aisles, which are then returned to CRAC or PAHU units. Environmental Parameters Maintaining proper temperature and humidity is critical for FTTH server room reliability: Temperature: Typically 18–27°C at the cold aisle intake, depending on equipment specifications. Humidity: Relative humidity should be maintained between 40–60% to prevent static discharge and condensation. Monitoring: Continuous monitoring with temperature a...
