Environmental Considerations Outdoor installations may include weatherproof enclosures or aerial cable supports. Indoor diagrams may indicate fire-rated conduits and compliance with building codes .

Bend Radius and Handling Diagrams often mark minimum bend radius to prevent fiber damage .

Pulling tension limits and proper cable handling techniques are critical to avoid microbends or breaks.
