Splice points and slack storage must be carefully planned to allow maintenance access without interfering with power lines.

Electrical Safety: Even though ADSS cables are dielectric, strong electric fields from high-voltage lines can induce surface tracking or dry-band arcing if the cable is contaminated with dust or moisture. Installation must follow IEEE and ASTM standards to minimize risks of dielectric breakdown and ensure long-term reliability. Adequate clearance from energized conductors is required, and grounding of nearby metallic structures is recommended.
