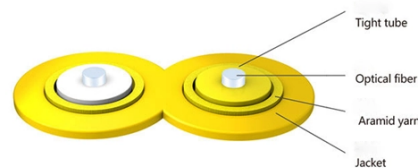

- Typical support spans:** For ladder or perforated trays, supports are usually placed every 1.5 to 3 meters, depending on tray width, material thickness, and cable load.
- Load considerations:** Wider trays or trays carrying heavy power cables may require closer support spacing to prevent sagging.
- Small-diameter cables:** For control or instrumentation cables, narrower trays (6–12 inches) with standard rung spacing are sufficient.
