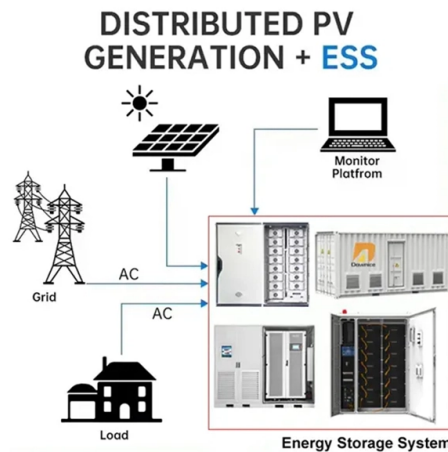


How to attach a fiber optic cable junction box to a utility pole
