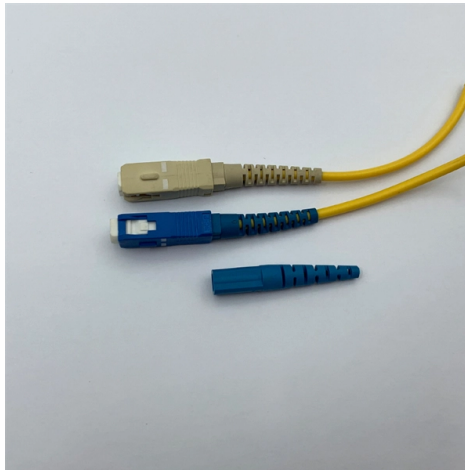

Splicing: Fusion splicing is the most common method, where fibers from the ODF feeder cable are fused with fibers in the FDB. Splice trays in the FDB protect the fusion joints and store excess fiber slack to maintain the minimum bending radius.

Patch Cord Connection: In some cases, pre-terminated patch cords with SC, LC, or ST connectors are used to link the ODF to the FDB. This allows flexible insertion, removal, and testing of optical paths.

Distribution to Drop Cables: Within the FDB, PLC splitters may divide a single feeder signal into multiple outputs. Drop cables are then routed from the FDB to end-user premises or fiber terminal boxes, completing the FTTH access network.
