

How to connect the neutral wire to a household electrical distribution box

Twist the exposed copper strands to prevent fraying. Connect to the Bus Bar: Insert the stripped end of the neutral wire under a terminal screw on the neutral bus bar. Only one wire per terminal is recommended to ensure a secure, low-resistance connection. Tighten the screw firmly but avoid over-tightening, which could damage the wire. Check for Proper Routing: Ensure the wire is neatly bundled and does not cross or touch other conductors unnecessarily. Keep it separated from hot wires to prevent accidental shorts. Restore Power: Once all connections are secure, replace the panel cover and turn the main breaker back on. Test the circuits to ensure proper operation.
