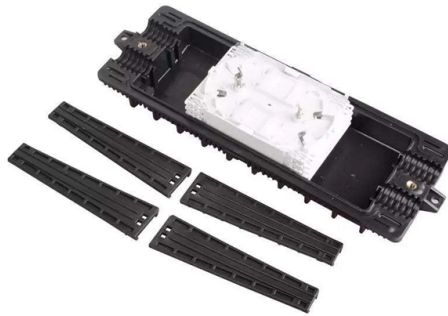

Testing with a Multimeter: Set the multimeter to measure voltage, continuity, or resistance. With power off, test continuity between hot and neutral, hot and ground, and neutral and ground to ensure proper connections. With power on, measure voltage across hot and neutral to confirm correct voltage levels.

Non-Contact Voltage Tester: Use this tool to detect live wires without touching them, which is useful for tracing hidden wiring.

Wire Tracing: For wires inside walls, a wire tracer or toner can help identify the path and endpoints without damaging walls.
