

How to plug a fiber optic cable into a router port

- Power On the Router:** Plug in the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm connectivity.
- Configure Router (if needed):** Access the router's admin panel via a browser (usually 192.168.1.1) and enter ISP credentials if required.

Tips and Precautions

- Do not bend the fiber cable sharply; it can damage the delicate glass strands.
- Keep connectors clean; dust or dirt can degrade signal quality.
- Verify connection lights: ONT lights should show power and active PON/Optical link; router WAN light should indicate internet connectivity.
- Placement:** Keep both ONT and router near power outlets in a dry, ventilated area.
