

# Installation of Mobile Broadband Fiber Distribution Box

**Wall Mounting:** Mark drill points, insert wall plugs, and secure the box with screws. Ensure it is level and stable.  
**Pole Mounting:** Use the provided pole mounting kit or metal clamps to secure the box at a manageable height.  
**Rack Mounting:** Slide the box into a standard 19-inch rack and secure it with screws, following manufacturer instructions.

**Step 5: Prepare and Route Cables** Make entry points for incoming and outgoing cables using pre-cut holes or knockouts. Use cable glands or rubber grommets to protect fibers from sharp edges and maintain waterproof or dustproof integrity. Route the fiber optic cables into the box carefully, avoiding shar...
