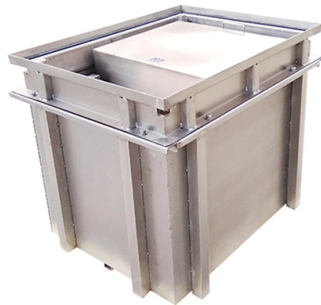


Is it okay to use leather cable directly as pigtail
