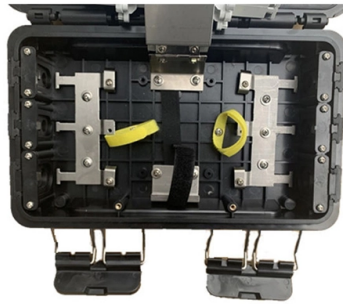


Methods for fixing cable tray supports and hangers

Types of Supports and Hangers

- Spacing:** Supports should be spaced according to load and tray type. Typical spacing is 1.2–2 meters for straight runs, with additional supports near bends, tees, or offsets.
- Alignment:** Ensure trays are level and straight. Misalignment can cause cable stress and reduce system lifespan.
- Mounting:** Use approved fittings and spring knots to secure trays to supports. Expansion fittings should be installed where thermal expansion is expected.
- Corrosion Protection:** Select appropriate finishes such as hot-dip galvanization for wet or corrosive environments.
- Clearances:** Maintain at least 50 mm clearance from floors and avoid direct mounting to surfaces that may cause heat or moisture damage.
- Cable Retention:** Install retaining bars or insulating devices to prevent cables from falling out when covers are removed.

Safety and Compliance

- Load Considerations:** Supports must withstand the weight of cables, equipment, and environmental forces like wind or snow.
- Cable Fill:** Avoid overfilling trays to prevent overheating and maintain ampacity, following NEC 392.22 guidelines.
