Service Providers Several private companies provide fiber optic services across the Philippines. Major providers include PLDT, Globe, Converge ICT, Streamtech, PT&T, Red Fiber, and Eastern Communications . Coverage varies by region, with urban areas like Metro Manila, Cebu, and select parts of Luzon and Visayas having the most extensive access. Many providers offer end-to-end fiber networks, no data caps, and bundled services such as cable TV .
