

## Relay protection does not output

5. Testing Limitations Protection relays are designed to operate under fault conditions. Testing under normal conditions may not trigger outputs. Complex software logic, Ethernet peer-to-peer connections, or extensive protection schemes can also prevent outputs from activating during routine checks.

.Troubleshooting Steps

- Verify Power Supply – Ensure the relay and its trip circuits are receiving proper voltage.
- Check Configuration – Confirm output settings, latched/unlatched status, and security levels. Acknowledge any pending trips if required.
- Inspect Wiring and Load – Verify connections to RO and COM terminals, and ensure external protection elements are installed for inductive or capacitive loads ....
