- Accessibility:** Panels must be easily accessible, with a clear workspace of at least 36 inches in front and 30 inches on the sides, and sufficient headroom for safe operation.
- Location:** Ideal locations are basements, garages, or utility rooms that are dry, free from flammable materials, and not obstructed by appliances or storage. Panels cannot be placed in closets with ignitable materials or in areas that compromise safety.
- Height:** The center of the highest breaker should not be more than 6 feet above the finished floor.
