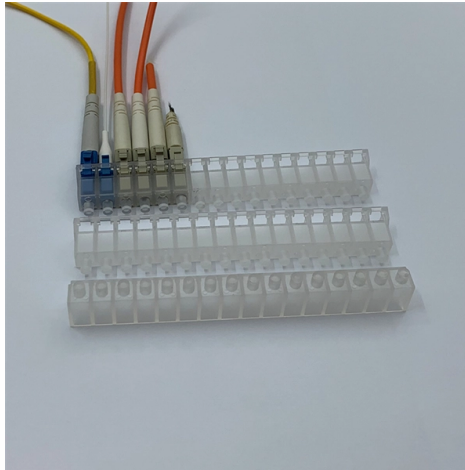

Using GUI on Managed Switches For switches with a web-based dashboard, such as Ruckus or Aruba AOS-Switches, the routing table can be accessed as follows: Ruckus Switches: Navigate to the Dashboard > Networking Devices > Switch tab, select the switch, go to Troubleshooting > IP Route, and click Show Route to view the routing table. Aruba AOS-Switches: In the Network Operations app, filter for the switch, select Manage > Devices > Switches, click the switch, then go to Overview > Routing. The routing tab displays total routes, static routes, connected routes, and details such as destination network, gateway, VLAN, and static route indicators. Understanding Routing Table Entries A typical routing table entry includes: Destination: The network address of the route. Subnet Mask: Used to match the destination IP. Gateway/Next Hop: IP address of the next device to forward packets. Outgoing Interface: The interface through which packets are sent. Metric: Indicates the cost or preference of the route, often based on hop count or administrative distance.
