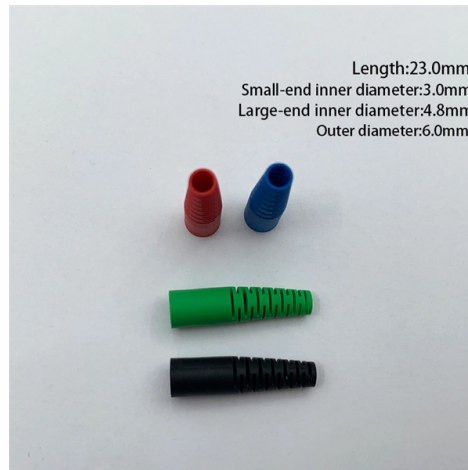


What to do if the fiber optic cable disconnects
