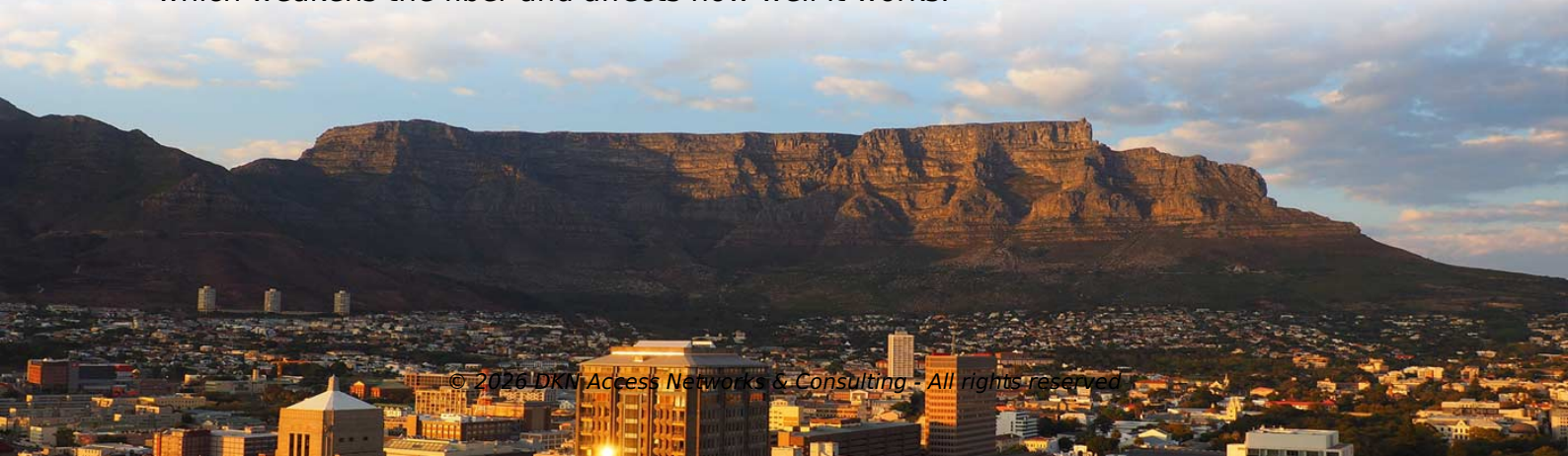

The angle of the pliers to the fiber should not be too flat, otherwise there is a risk of bending the fiber too much and stressing it when stripping. Glass doesn't like that.
